


Inspection Frequency

- Retention Ponds monthly, twice yearly
- Detention Basins twice yearly
- Critical Culverts monthly and after >1" rain
- Underground Detention Basins twice yearly
- Privately-Owned WQ BMPs annually
- City-Owned WQ BMPs annually, quarterly





Inspection Tracking



















Inventories + Inspections = Asset Mgmt

- Retention Ponds Accela
- Detention Basins Accela
- Critical Culverts Accela and paper
- Underground Detention Basins Excel, but next to transition to Accela
- Privately-Owned WQ BMPs Excel
- City-Owned WQ BMPs Accela (as of 3/30/18)



Maintenance by LFUCG

- All city-owned Post-Construction Controls
- Structural components of detention basins and retention ponds in residential areas that are in an easement
- Post-Construction Controls on commercial properties = NEVER (#goals)



Maintenance by LFUCG

- Maintenance effort needed (low to high):
 - MS4 / Water Quality staff
 - DOE UPC Contractors
 - DES Woody Debris / Litter Contractors
 - Streets and Roads Maintenance staff
 - Sewer Line Maintenance staff
 - Storm Sewer System Cleaning / Rehabilitation Contractor
 - Design and Bid



Seeking Compliance

- Follow Enforcement Response Plan
 - Verbal warnings
 - NOVs
 - Refer to DES for escalating enforcement
